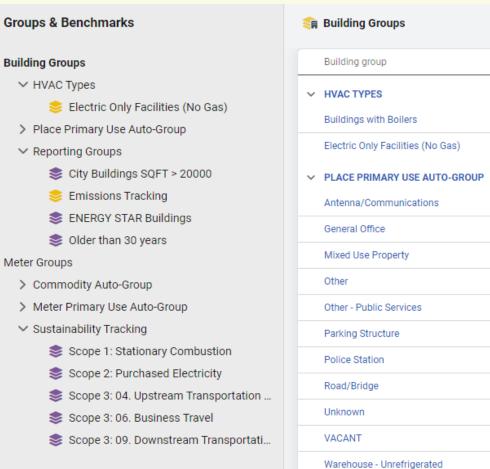

Groups help you compare like buildings or meters using benchmarks.

Create your own groups based on attributes important to you.

Use groups as a filter in dashboards, reports, and bill lists.

- Custom fields allow you to track additional fields that are not native to the UtilityManagement app.
- Custom fields are available for:
 - Buildings
 - Meters
 - Accounts
 - Channels
 - Vendors
 - Rate Schedules

Creating a manual group

- 1. In the Groups and Benchmarks module, click on **Building Groups** or **Meter Groups**
- 2. Click the +
- 3. Enter a name for the group
- 4. Select a category or add a new category for the group.
- 5. Decide if all users can see all the buildings in the group even if they don't have topmost permission.
- 6. Click Manual.
- 7. Click on the buildings or meters you want to be included in the group
- 8. Click Save & View

Creating an automatic group

- 1. In the Groups and Benchmarks module, click on **Building Groups** or **Meter Groups**
- 2. Click the +
- 3. Enter a name for the group.
- 4. Select a category or add a new category for the group.
- 5. Decide if all users can see all the buildings in the group even if they don't have topmost permission
- 6. Click Automatic
- 7. Add filters to include the specific buildings or meters in the group
- 8. Click Save & View
